"I will tell of Thy greatness." Ps. 145:6b

Sharing faith seems to be one of the greatest challenges for believers. I suppose there are so many factors that cause us to hesitate. But perhaps one of the greatest obstacles to sharing faith is not courage, resolve or obedience but perhaps the greatness of God has eluded our own walk with God. In Psalm 145 David seems to be writing from the perspective of his final years. He has walked with God, and he has experienced God's greatness in both victories and in fleeing the enemy. Now, the aged king can look back and remember. Now the great King of Israel wants to share that greatness with the next generation.

"Men shall speak of the power of Your awesome acts, And I will tell of Your greatness. They shall eagerly utter the memory of Your abundant goodness And will shout joyfully of Your righteousness."

Ps. 145:6-7.

A wondrous challenge of passing forward that experience of walking with God! How else will that new generation, those outside of our fellowship ever know of the beauty of walking with God unless they hear our words, see it in our eyes and experience the joy and trust that guides our own lives? But the question for each of us is: "do I know of God's greatness?" You truly cannot pass forward what you yourself have not witnessed, what you yourself have not chosen in your own path. Church gatherings throughout the world are often filled with those who come, listen, perhaps even pray some futile memorized word and walk away unmoved, unchanged and with no story of faith, no resolve of glory. The somberness of their worship reflects the emptiness of their lives.

So, the question is: Does my very being tell of the greatness of God? Do people see me and want more for themselves, knowing that in God there is abundant goodness? I love how David expresses the path of sending this message of life with God forward to new peoples, new generations: ***They shall eagerly utter the memory of Your abundant goodness And will shout joyfully of your righteousness.***" Ps. 145:7.

At church and in life, does this describe you? Don't be the one who sits apart and sulks, calling everyone to sympathize and pity. Be the one who places your foot front and center and praises God. Not for your glory but God's glory. Don't be the one who refuses to sing, refuses to voice God's word. But regardless of your voice, make sure you praise God. And be that one known for gratitude and resolve in each day you live.

David said: ***"I will tell of Thy greatness."*** What story does your life tell? Is your story, your voice, your heart, words and actions declaring the greatness of God? or is your life one that clouds the sky, dampens the fire of one's heart and looks not to heaven but to the dust of the earth. The truth is that you are telling a story. Which story are you choosing to tell. That is vital because in the end, regardless of the world or my own life's struggles, I am the one who chooses which story to tell. ***"I will tell of Thy greatness."***
